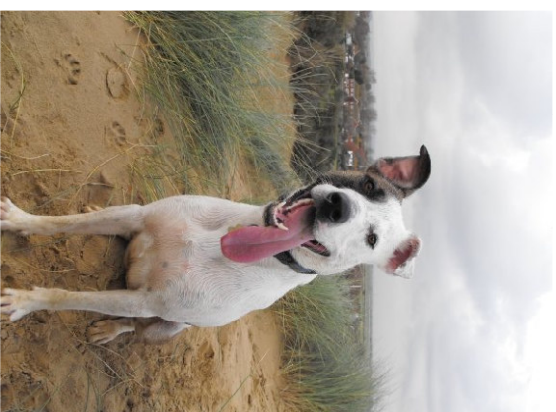

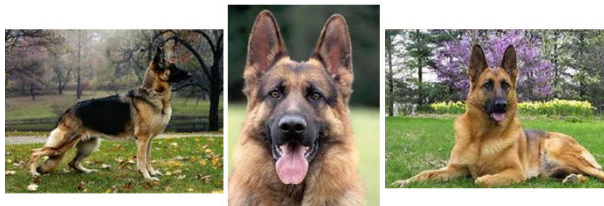

German Shepherd Dog

The German Shepherd Dog is intelligent and eager to please. They are extremely loyal and protective of their families, and suspicious of strangers, especially in the company of their masters. They are devoted and fearless. They have a high learning ability and are extremely responsive to training. If not properly socialised at an early age, they can be unruly due to a lack of self-confidence. If timid, they may be prone to fear biting.

Associated Health Traits

The German Shepherd Dog is prone to hip and elbow dysplasia. They may also suffer from aortic stenosis, an abnormal narrowing of the aortic valve, which may impede the flow of blood to the arteries. They may also have chronic eczema and flea allergies.



American Staffordshire Terrier

The American Staffordshire Terrier is an intelligent, confident dog. It can be highly protective of his owner and the owner's property. It is a courageous and persistent fighter if provoked. If not properly socialized they may become dog aggressive. The American Staffordshire Terrier needs a firm consistent owner who understands how to achieve pack leader status.

Associated Health Traits

May be prone to heart murmurs, thyroid problems, skin allergies, tumors, hip dysplasia and congenital heart disease.



Boxer

Highly intelligent, the Boxer is happy, playful and curious, but can be stubborn and sneaky. They bond closely with their families and get along well with children. It is believed that their name originated from the way that they like to use their front paws for everything, in an almost cat-like way. They make excellent watchdogs, as their nature is to protect you, your family and your home.

Associated Health Traits

The Boxer may have Cardiomyopathy and subaortic stenosis. After the age of eight, they are more prone to tumours than any other breed. Their digestive systems may cause them to suffer from excessive flatulence.



Irish Setter

Energetic and high spirited, the Irish Setter is intelligent and affectionate. They get along well with children and other animals and have no guarding instincts. It is important that they be firmly trained from an early age, as they pick up bad habits easily. They have an excellent sense of smell and enjoy the outdoors. Some may be highly strung and impulsive, others more reserved.

Associated Health Traits

The Irish Setter tends to suffer from bloat, so should be fed two or three small meals each day rather than one large one. They are particularly prone to epilepsy and severe skin allergies. Their ears should be watched for inflammation. They may also develop Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA). They may have hypothyroidism or auto-immune disorders.
